

of the Soviet Jew is desperate. He is allowed neither to live as a Jew nor to leave; he is made the scapegoat for Soviet economic and political failures. To ameliorate this situation, world concern must be focused on the plight of the Soviet Jew and continuing protests made to the leaders of the USSR.
